March Newsletter



The Brew & Renew Thrift Store and fundraising activities were reviewed for 2023. Over \$15,000 was raised through these two ventures. A huge thank you to Pam and Kurt Vandermeer for their countless hours put into the thrift store. Popularity is growing and it helps us sustain our congregation.


