Welcome to "almost winter." It's been an amazing fall. After recent years, it's amazing we had a fall. Recently we've jumped from winter to summer and from summer to winter, with spring and fall weather totaling two or three days. This year it's been a beautiful, traditional fall. Well, OK, much, much more beautiful than a traditional fall. But we all know what's coming. This morning I had to scrape my car windows for the first time this fall, and it's all downhill from here.

I've always had a love-hate relationship with November, and the older I get, the more that relationship shifts to the right. It's my birth month, but I have to admit, birthdays aren't nearly as much fun as they used to be. At least when I was running foot races I could look forward to the big birthdays. They give awards based on your age, usually in a range e.g. 20-29 and 30-39, so if you hit the big 4-0 you would lose a lot of faster competition.

November has always been a prelude to, if not the beginning of winter. I know the U.S. Military says winter doesn't start until the Winter Solstice on December 21st, but in this part of the country at least, November so rarely listens to the commander in chief. I remember years when it snowed before my birthday and drifts continuously covered the ground through March. The National Weather Service (what's left of it) is predicting a La Nina winter, which, in general, means colder and snowier winters on the Northern Plains. Won't that be fun!

When I was young, about 100 years ago (my memory isn't what it used to be either), winter was a time for play. Now just the thought of sledding for hours at a time gives me a backache and I'm exhausted just contemplating it. Then there are the blizzards. How many times has it started to snow as I leave the church and head for home? Just last winter, driving home from Confirmation in Ada on two different evenings, I found myself in ground blizzards where I couldn't see ten feet in front of my car, yet I could see the stars above as clear as if I was looking through a telescope. The "blizzard" was only seven feet tall, but that didn't make it any easier to see to drive.

41% of Americans prefer fall over all other seasons, with 24% choosing either spring or summer, and 11% preferring winter. Those who love fall must be hunters. Those who prefer winter are probably those crazy snowmobilers, who are always praying for more snow. And maybe that's the key to learning to appreciate November again: find fun things to do that we can't do other times of the year.

But it's hard. Some people are "leaf-peepers" who will travel hundreds of miles to see the leaves turn colors. I see them and all I can think is what a pain it will be to rake them up (more backaches and exhaustion). Some wait all year to go hunting. I look at a big buck and see Bambi's father. I talked to a Norman County deputy who hunts bear with a bow. That to me seems like a spectacularly bad idea. I've stood in slews before sunup with the sleet coming down waiting for the ducks to show and I would start adding up the cost (license, duck stamp, shells, shotgun, waders, camo clothes). Then I would balance my dislike of duck with my love of a good steak and realized that for the same amount of money I paid for that waterfowl, I could be eating filet mignon three times a week. And I wouldn't have to get out of bed hours before the sun does, nor stand in a sleet storm with bone-chillingly cold water up to my waist, to get it.

Maybe I've just turned into a curmudgeon who needs an attitude adjustment. God has given me each day in November to do with as I will (within reason). Who am I to reject those gifts? Pray for me to learn to again appreciate all God has done for me and enjoy all the gifts God provides. This year I vow to try to once again love winter, although sledding is still out of the question. Maybe I'll buy a riding snowblower. Maybe I'll even pick up a snowmobile. With that combination, maybe then I too would pray for snow. OK, now I know I've gone too far. Still, enjoy each day you've been given.
